

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IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Read these instructions All the safety and operating instructions should be read before this product is operated.
- Keep these instructions The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- Heed all warnings All warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- Follow all instructions All operating and use instructions should be followed.
- Do not use this apparatus near water The appliance should not be used near water or moisture – for example, in a wet basement or near a swimming pool, and the like.
- Clean only with a dry cloth.
- Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding-type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.
- Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.
- Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacture.
- Use only with the cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus.
 When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/ apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over.



- Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
- Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing
 is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any
 way, such as the power-supply cord or plug is damaged,
 liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the
 apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or
 moisture, does not operate normally, or has been dropped.
- · Keep the unit in a well-ventilated environment.

WARNING: To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not expose this apparatus to rain or moisture. The apparatus should not be exposed to dripping or splashing. Objects filled with liquids, such as vases should not be placed on the apparatus.

WARNING: The batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire, or the like.

WARNING: The main plug is used as a disconnect device. The disconnect device shall remain readily operable.

WARNING: To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not remove the cover (or back) as there are no user-serviceable parts inside. Refer servicing to qualified personnel.

This equipment is a Class II or double insulated electrical appliance. It has been designed in such a way that it does not require a safety connection to electrical earth.

ADDITIONAL SAFETY INFORMATION

To ensure reliable and safe operation of your new TV, read this user manual carefully, including safety information below.

Electrical Safety

- The TV set should only be connected to a main power supply with a voltage that matches the label at the rear of the product.
- To prevent overload, do not share the same power supply socket with too many other electronic components.
- Do not place any connecting wires where they may be stepped on or tripped over.
- Do not place heavy items on them, which may damage the leads.
- Hold the main plug, not the wires, when removing from a socket.
- During a thunderstorm, or when not using the television for extended period of time, turn off the power switch on the back of the television.
- Do not allow water or moisture to enter the TV or power adapter. Do NOT use in wet, moist areas, such as bathrooms, steamy kitchens, or near swimming pools.
- Pull the plug out immediately, and seek professional help if the main plug or cable is damaged, liquid is split onto the set, if accidentally exposed to water or moisture, if anything accidentally penetrates the ventilation slots, or if the set does not work normally.
- Do not remove the safety covers. There are no user serviceable parts inside. Trying to service the unit yourself is dangerous and may invalidate the product's warranty.
- To avoid battery leakage, remove exhausted batteries from the remote control, or when not using for long period.
- Do not break open or throw exhausted batteries on a fire.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not mix Alkaline, Standard (Carbon-Zinc) or Rechargeable (Nickel Cadmium) or (Nickel Metal Hydride) batteries.

Physical Safety

- Do not block ventilation slots in the back cover. You may place the TV in a cabinet, but ensure at least 2" (5 cm) clearance all around.
- Do not tap or shake the TV screen, or you may damage the internal circuits. Take good care of the remote control.
- To clean the TV use a soft dry cloth. Do not use solvents or petroleum-based fluids.
- Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong, the wide blade, or the third prong is provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.

- Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs.
- Unplug the apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods.
- Refer all servicing to a qualified service personnel.

- Always connect your television to a power outlet with protective ground connection.

WARNING: Never place a television in an unstable location. A television may fall, causing serious personal injury or death. Many injuries, particularly to children, can be avoided by taking simple precautions such as:

- Using cabinets or stands recommended by the manufacturer of the television.
- Only using furniture that can safely support the television.
- Making sure that the television is not overhanging the edge of the supporting furniture.
- Not placing the television on tall furniture (for example, cupboards or bookcases) without anchoring both the furniture and the television to a suitable support.
- Not placing the television on cloth or other materials that may be located between the television and supporting furniture.
- Educating children about the dangers of climbing on furniture to reach the television or its controls.




BACK VIEW





FRONT VIEW- 65"



IR SENSOR	Receives signals from your remote.



GETTING TO KNOW YOUR TV (CONT.)

REMOTE CONTROL

- **(i)**
- If there is light around the TV, the remote control may fail or work abnormally.
- Remove the batteries from the remote control when not in use for a long period of time.
- To prevent battery leakage, which may result in bodily injury or damage to the remote:
 - 1. Install all batteries correctly, and as marked on the remote control.
 - 2. Do not mix old and new batteries and do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (NiCad, NiMg, etc.) batteries.






INSTALLING THE STAND



Do not install the stands if you want to mount your TV to the wall. See the instructions that came with your wall mounting hardware.

You will need: Phillips screwdriver (not included)

- 1. Remove any plastic wrapping from the TV and stands, and place the TV screen-down on a clean, flat surface to prevent scratches or damage to the screen.
- 2. Attach each stand into place with the provided screws and a Phillips screwdriver.







3. Place the TV on a stable, level surface.

INSTALLING REMOTE BATTERIES

1. Remove the cover from the remote control's battery compartment.



2. Insert two AAA batteries, making sure to match the + and – terminals to the symbols in the compartment.



3. Replace the battery cover.

Remove the batteries from the remote control when not in use for a long period time.



CONNECTING DEVICES

CABLE/SATELLITE BOX


You can use HDMI, composite (AV), component, or coaxial to connect your cable/satellite box to your TV. **HDMI**



- 1. Connect an HDMI cable (not included) to the HDMI OUT port on your cable/satellite box.
- 2. Connect the other end of the cable to the HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3, or HDMI 4 port on the back of your TV.
- 3. Connect a coaxial cable (not included) from your cable/satellite box to a coaxial wall jack.
- 4. If you're connecting a cable box, follow instructions from your cable service provider to search for channels.




COMPONENT



- Connect a component cable's (not included) red, blue, and green connectors to your cable/satellite box.
- 2. Connect the other end of the component cable to the **VIDEO/Y**, **Pb**, and **Pr** jacks on the back of your TV, matching the cable's colored connectors to the jacks.
- 3. Connect an audio cable's (not included) white and red connectors to the audio out jacks on your cable/satellite box.
- 4. Connect the other end of the audio cable to the AUDIO IN jacks on the back of your TV.
- 5. Connect a coaxial cable (not included) from your cable/satellite box to a coaxial wall jack.
- 6. If you're connecting a cable box, follow instructions from your cable service provider to search for channels.

- Some component cables have the white and red audio connectors built in. If they are not, you will need a separate RCA audio cable.
 - Make sure that you match the connectors' colors with the jacks you are connecting them to.
 - To use the cable/satellite box, press the **INPUT** button repeatedly to select **Component/AV**.

COMPOSITE (AV)




- 1. Connect an AV (composite) cable (not included) to the AV jacks on your cable/satellite box.
- Connect the other end of the cable to the AUDIO IN and VIDEO/Y jacks on the back of your TV. The cable connectors' colors should match the TV jacks' colors.
- 3. Connect a coaxial cable (not included) from your cable/satellite box to a coaxial wall jack.
- 4. If you're connecting a cable box, follow instructions from your cable service provider to search for channels.



Make sure that you match the connectors' colors with the jacks you are connecting them to.
 To use the cable/satellite box, press the INPUT button on your remote control repeatedly to select Component/AV.


COAXIAL



- Connect a coaxial cable (not included) to your cable/satellite box.
- 2. Connect the other end of the cable to the **DTV/TV** jack on your TV.
- 3. Connect the other end of the coaxial cable to a coaxial wall jack.
- 4. See "SEARCHING FOR CHANNELS" on page 28 to run a channel scan.

- To use the cable/satellite box, press the INPUT button repeatedly to select TV.
- If you are connecting your TV to a coaxial wall jack, go to your TV channel settings and switch to Cable.



ANTENNA




- 1. Connect a coaxial cable (not included) to your antenna.
- 2. Connect the other end of the cable to the DTV/TV jack on your TV.
- 3. See "SEARCHING FOR CHANNELS" on page 28 to run a channel scan.



- To use the antenna, press the **INPUT** button repeatedly to select **TV**.
- If you are switching between an antenna and cable/satellite box, go to your TV's Channel settings and switch to Air (antenna) or Cable (cable/satellite box).

DVD/BLU-RAY PLAYER


You can use HDMI, composite (AV), component, or coaxial to connect your DVD/Blu-ray player to your TV. **HDMI**



- 1. Connect an HDMI cable (not included) to the HDMI OUT port on your DVD or Blu-ray player.
- 2. Connect the other end of the cable to the HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3, or HDMI 4 port on the back of your TV.
- To use the DVD/Blu-ray player, press the **INPUT** button repeatedly to select the port you connected it to (**HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3**, or **HDMI 4**).


DVD/BLU-RAY PLAYER (CONT.)

COMPONENT



- 1. Connect a component cable's (not included) red, blue, and green connectors to your DVD or Blu-ray player.
- 2. Connect the other end of the component cable to the **VIDEO/Y**, **Pb**, and **Pr** jacks on the back of your TV, matching the cable's colored connectors to the jacks.
- 3. Connect an audio cable's (not included) white and red connectors to the audio out jacks on your DVD or Blu-ray player.
- 4. Connect the other end of the audio cable to the AUDIO IN jacks on the back of your TV.

- Some component cables have the white and red audio connectors built in. If they are not, you will need a separate RCA audio cable.
- Make sure that you match the connectors' colors with the jacks you are connecting them to.
- To use the DVD/Blu-ray player, press the INPUT button repeatedly to select Component/AV.

COMPOSITE (AV)



- 1. Connect an AV (composite) cable (not included) to the AV jacks on your DVD or Blu-ray player.
- Connect the other end of the cable to the AUDIO IN and VIDEO/Y jacks on the back of your TV. The cable connectors' colors should match the TV jacks' colors.



GAME CONSOLE


You can use HDMI or composite (AV) to connect your game console to your TV.

HDMI



- 1. Connect an HDMI cable (not included) to the HDMI OUT port on your game console.
- 2. Connect the other end of the cable to the HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3, or HDMI 4 port on the back of your TV.
- To use the game console, press the **INPUT** button repeatedly to select the port you connected it to (**HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3,** or **HDMI 4**).

COMPOSITE/AV




- 1. Connect an AV (composite) cable (not included) to the AV jacks on your game console.
- Your may need a console-specific cable for AV connections. See your game console's instructions for more information.
- 2. Connect the other end of the cable to the **AUDIO IN** and VIDEO/Y jacks on the back of your TV. The cable connectors' colors should match the TV jacks' colors.
- To use the game console, press the INPUT button repeatedly to select Component/AV.

LAPTOP/COMPUTER

You can use HDMI to connect your laptop/computer to your TV.

HDMI




- 1. Connect an HDMI cable (not included) to the HDMI OUT port on your laptop/computer.
- 2. Connect the other end of the cable to the HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3, or HDMI 4 port on the back of your TV.



- To use the computer, press the **INPUT** button repeatedly to select the port you connected it to (**HDMI 1**, **HDMI 2**, **HDMI 3**, or **HDMI 4**).
- You may need to adjust the display properties on your laptop/computer.

FLASH DRIVE



• Connect your USB Type-A flash drive to your TV's USB port.




To use the flash drive, press the **MEDIA** button on your remote, or press the **INUT** button repeatedly to select the **USB** input source. See "**VIEWING USB MULTIMEDIA**" on page 21 for more information.



SPEAKERS


You can use a digital optical cable, 3.5 mm audio cable, or 3.5 mm-to-RCA cable to connect your speakers to your TV. **DIGITAL OPTICAL CABLE**



- 1. Connect a digital optical audio cable (not included) to your audio device.
- 2. Connect the other end of the cable to the Digital Audio Out (OPTICAL) jack on the back of your TV.
- 3. When your TV is connected to power, open the Audio menu and make sure that the Digital Audio Output option is set to **PCM**:
 - Press the MENU button to display the main menu.
 - Press the ▼ ▲ buttons to select the Audio menu, then press the ▶ button or OK to make changes in the category.
 - Press the ▼ ▲ buttons to select the Digital Audio Output setting, then press the ◀ ▶ buttons to change it to PCM.
 - Press the EXIT button to save your changes and close the menu.


SPEAKERS (CONT.)

3.5 MM AUDIO CABLE




 Connect a 3.5 mm audio cable from the LINE OUT jack on the back of your TV to your home theater system or soundbar.

3.5 MM TO RCA CABLE



- 1. To listen to audio through your home theater system or soundbar, connect the 3.5 mm connector from the **LINE OUT** jack on the back of your TV.
- 2. Connect the RCA end of the cable to the audio in jacks on your home theater system or soundbar. The connectors' colors should match the TV jacks' colors.

STREAMING DEVICES



• Connect your streaming device to the HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3, or HDMI 4 port on the back of your TV.








FIRST USE

PLUGGING IN THE TV

- 1. Make sure that all of your peripheral devices are connected to your TV.
- Connect the power cord to a power outlet. The TV enters standby mode and its indicator lights red.





3. Press O (power) on the TV or remote control to turn on the TV. The red indicator turns off.



The $\mbox{\it U}$ (power) button on the TV or remote control can only switch the TV into standby mode. To completely turn off the TV, disconnect the power cord from the power socket.

SETUP WIZARD

- Press the ▼▲◀► buttons to select or change a setting:
 - TV Location: Set the TV location to Store for retail display use or set to Home for home use.
 - Menu Language: Select the language you want to be displayed in the menu. The default language is English.
 - Time Zone: Select a time zone.
 - · Daylight Saving: Select to turn daylight saving time on or off.
 - Time format: Select the displayed time format.
 - Air/Cable: Select whether you want to connect your TV to an antenna (Air) or a coaxial wall jack (Cable).
 - Cable System: Select a cable system.

IRC and HRC are methods for reducing interference in older cable lines. If you're in a rural area with older lines, you may get better performance by selecting **IRC** or **HRC**. Modern cables do not need signal improvements, so most people will have the best results with **STD** or **Auto**.



OPERATING THE TV

TURNING ON/OFF

Press Φ (power) on the TV or remote control to turn your TV on or off. The LED lights red while in standby mode (off) and off when turned on.



The Θ (power) button on the TV or remote control can only switch the TV into standby mode. To completely turn off the TV, disconnect the power cord from the power outlet.

SELECTING AN INPUT SOURCE

- Press the INPUT button on your TV or remote to display the INPUT SOURCE list.
- 2. Press the ▼ ▲ buttons to select your input source, then press the **OK** button to confirm.



SELECTING CHANNELS

When watching cable TV or TV with an antenna:

- Press the CHY/CH↑ buttons on the TV or remote repeatedly to select a channel.
- Press the 0-9 buttons on the remote control to select a channel directly.

ADJUSTING THE VOLUME

- Press the VOL+/- buttons on the TV or on the remote to adjust the volume.
- Press the MUTE button to turn the sound off. To resume the sound, press the VOL+ button or MUTE again.

VIEWING USB MULTIMEDIA



The TV supports JPEG files.

- 1. Connect a flash drive to the USB port on the back of your TV.
- 2. Press the **MEDIA** button on your remote, or press the **INPUT** button repeatedly to select the **USB** input source.
- 3. Select **PHOTO**, use the **▼▲ ►** buttons to browse, and then press **OK** to select a photo or folder.
- 4. To view photos:
 - ▶II Play/Pause: Press to start or pause the photo playback.
 - Stop: Press to stop photo playback.
 - Id Skip back: Press to view the previous photo.
 - No Skip forward: Press to view the next photo.
 - **REPEAT**: Press to select a different repeat mode.




CUSTOMIZING TV SETTINGS


Learn how to navigate your TV's menu and review the available options in the Picture, Audio, Time, Setup, Lock, and Channel menus.

NAVIGATING THE SETTINGS MENU

- 1. Press the **MENU** button to open the menu.
- 2. Press the ◀▶ buttons to select a menu category, then press the ▼ button or **OK** to make changes in the category.
- 3. Press the ▼ ▲ buttons to select a setting, then press the ◀ ▶ button to change the setting.
- 4. When you are finished, press the **EXIT** button to save your changes and close the menu.




VIDEO



Options include:

Picture Mode: Cycle through the picture modes: Dynamic, Movie, Custom, or Standard.



- Brightness: Increase or decrease the amount of white in the picture.
- **Contrast:** Adjust the difference between light and dark levels in the pictures.
- Color: Control the color intensity.
- Tint: Adjust the balance between red and green levels.
- Sharpness: Adjust the level of crispness in the edges between light and dark areas of the picture.
- Color Temperature: Cycle through color temperatures: Standard, Warm, or Cool.
- Advanced Setting:
 - Aspect: Select a screen mode: Normal, Wide, Zoom, Cinema or Full 100% (only for HDMI source).
 - Noise Reduction: Reduce the noise level of the connected device: Off, Low, Middle, or High.
 - Dynamic Contrast: Set the level to enhance the picture details.
 - HDMI Mode: Switch the HDMI source to set Auto, Video, or Graphic.



The Aspect options may differ depending on the selected input source.



AUDIO



Options include:

Sound Mode: Select an audio-enhancement technique: Standard, Custom, Movie, Sports, or Music.



- Treble: Control the relative intensity of higher-pitched sounds.
- Bass: Control the relative intensity of lower-pitched sounds.
- Balance: Adjust the audio output between the left and the right speakers.
- MTS: Select the analog audio output mode: Mono, Stereo, and SAP.
- Audio Languages: Select the audio language: English, French, or Spanish.
- Digital Output: Select the digital audio output mode: RAW or PCM.
- Surround Sound: Provide an enhanced listening experience.
- Perfect Volume: Volume levels are automatically controlled to keep at the same level when switch channels.

TIME



Options include:

• Sleep Timer: Select a period of time after which the TV automatically switches to standby mode: off, 5min, 10min, 15min, 30min, 60min, 90min, 120min, 180min, or 240min.



- Time Zone: Select a time zone: Pacific, Alaska, Hawaii, Atlantic, Eastern, Central, or Mountain.
- Daylight Savings: Select to turn daylight saving time on or off.
- Time Format: Select the displayed time format.
- Auto Clock: Set the Auto Clock on or off.
- Clock: Set the clock manually when Auto Clock is set to off.

SETUP



Options include:

- Menu Language: Select a menu language: English or Español. The default on-screen menu language is English.
- OSD Timeout: Select the OSD displayed time.
- **Closed Cation:** Turn closed captioning on or off, select analog or digital modes, or personalize the captioning style.
 - CC Mode: Select CC On, CC Off, or CC on Mute.
 - Analog CC: Select the analog mode: CC1, CC2, CC3, CC4, Text1, Text2, Text3, or Text4.
 - Digital CC: Select digital mode: Service 1, Service 2, Service 3, Service 4, Service 5, or Service 6.
 - Option: Personalize the captioning style, such as the size and color of the digital caption.
- Over Scan: Select over scan to off to improve HDMI video quality.
- Input Label: Edit the input source name
- · Other Setting:

MAINTAINING YOUR TV
